
The drinks must be paid in cash at the restaurant (to our treasurer). No payments with checks or bank cards. The ONS must pay the joint bill in cash afterwards.

New book: Nikolaus Schindel "Sylloge Nummorum Arabicorum Österreich Band I"

The first ÖNG special publication was written by Nikolaus Schindel. It is titled "Sylloge Nummorum Arabicorum Austria Volume I: Early Islamic Copper Coins after the Reform of 77 AH (696/697 AD)" and presents early Islamic copper coins dating from the coin reform of the Umayyad caliph 'Abd al-Malik (77 AH, 696/697 AD) to the middle of the 8th century AD. The plates depict a total of 1,434 bronze coins in sylloge form. In addition, more than 150 pages offer a general overview of copper coinage from the Umayyad period, and the collection presented here is discussed in its broader numismatic context. This volume represents the first comprehensive treatment of Umayvad AE coinage since John Walker's 1956 British Museum catalog. While it does not aim for completeness, it can be used as a reference work for post-Reformation Islamic bronze coins up to c. 750 AD.Technical details:A4, hardcover, black and white, ISBN 978-3-200-10320-7.Order directly from the author, N. New book : Slawomir Liszewski, Identification of Kufic dirhams, handbook for beginners AH 132 – 334

Published by the author, 337 p, colour illustrations, hardback. Printed in 20 copies (not available for order).

The author, who does not speak Arabic, experienced as a collector of dirhams, had a lack of good literature to identify the coins. Especially being able to read the dates and the mints was difficult. Based on his own experiences he started to make his own handbook. It became a voluminous work with a lot of photos with details of dirhams. The first chapter in the book gives general information, after that come the chapters that provide useful information for reading the date (8-22), identifying 237 mints (23-113), determining the dynasty, rulers and identifying the names of officials on the obverse and reverse sides, by mint and year, and alphabetically (114-280) and the last chapter provides the key to recognizing the rulers of particular dynasties (281-337).
